Additionally, the papers also discuss Trump's upcoming filing with the NY Joint Commission on Public Ethics in response to the AG's targeted solicitation of campaign contributions from members of the Trump family and their representatives during the pendency of his investigation.

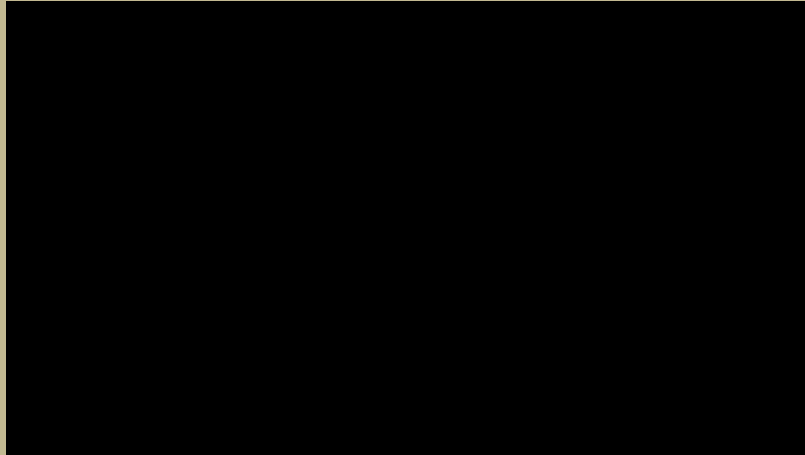

AG dirty, too: con Huntley bombshell

Even as she got a year in jail for political corruption, Shirley Huntley dropped a bombshell allegation yesterday about the state's top lawmaker — her lawyer told the sentencing judge that the disgraced ex-state senator has informed federal investigators about "corruption involving" Attorney General Eric Schneiderman.

Huntley also warned the FBI that there is "a mole" in Schneiderman's office who has leaked information, said defense lawyer Sally Butler in Brooklyn federal court.

The claims were immediately blasted by Schneiderman's office as desperate "lies" by a "criminal."

Huntley's lawyer made the shocking allegations against Schneiderman, a former Manhattan state senator, as she detailed Huntley's continued cooperation with the FBI since last year in a bid to win leniency.

Butler told Judge Jack Weinstein that Huntley "came at her own peril" with the information about Schneiderman to the FBI at the same time that the attorney general was investigating her for helping rip off yet another nonprofit.

"She also told the FBI about corruption involving Eric Schneiderman," Butler said, as well as "a mole in the Attorney General's Office."

State Attorney General Eric Schneiderman would like you to believe that, after layer upon layer of post-financial crisis

reforms, the banking sector is still an out-of-control mess and the average citizen is in desperate need of a crusader like himself to keep these legions of bad guys under control.

The absurdity of the argument only lends credibility to the claim being advanced by some people on Wall Street, and increasingly in Washington, that Schneiderman should be investigated, for leading possibly the most politicized law-enforcement outfit in the country.

Sources say the "investigate Schneiderman" movement is gaining traction among congressional Republicans, particularly in the House Financial Services Committee. One obvious reason: Schneiderman, a Democrat, seems to spare no expense in attacking critics of President Obama but hasn't lifted an investigative finger when it comes to the sleaze involving fat cats in his own party.

State Attorney General Eric Schneiderman was friendly with social-services honcho William Rapfogel before launching a criminal probe of him, records show.

Schneiderman appointed Rapfogel, the former longtime CEO of the Metropolitan Council on Jewish Poverty, to serve on his 32-member advisory panel on nonprofit revitalization in 2011.

Met Council also issued a press release lauding Schneiderman's visit to the agency that same year to help package kosher food for Passover.

Rapfogel and Schneiderman are both quoted in the agency's release touting the food-pantry services.

Before his election to AG, Schneiderman was a state senator and one of a bevy of politicians working with Met Council.

An ethics expert concluded their past relationship does not constitute a current conflict of interest.

"There's no reason to believe he would soft-pedal the investigation because he once put Rapfogel on an advisory council," said NYU Law Professor Stephen Gillers.

Schneiderman's office said the criminal probe of Rapfogel — who is accused of pocketing funds and directing campaign contributions to favored pols in a kickback scheme — will be conducted without fear or favor.
